



- 4. "Origin of Men and Women", 4ft


Discussion/ Essay Questions

- 1. Pocahontas had many names. What name was she born with? What did the other names mean/represent?
- 2. Historic accounts differ on what really happened with Pocahontas and John Smith. Research and debate from both sides of the argument. Which account has the greater evidence?
- 3. Did Pocahontas marry before John Rolfe? What happened to her "first husband"? Was she in love with Rolfe or forced to marry him?
- 4. How did Pocahontas change after living with the settlers?
- 5. How did the English people treat Pocahontas on her visit?
- 6. Discuss the different opinions of how Pocahontas died. Do we know where her body is today?

Activities

- Make a timeline of Pocahontas' life.
- Make a Yehakin (Powhatan home)
- Print a blank US map. Research and mark where many Native American tribes lived.
- Research more about Native Americans, how they lived back in the 1600s and how their culture has changed since then.
- Just for fun watch Disney's Pocahontas and Pocahontas II. Discuss the real version (or as close to real as you can find) of historic events vs. Disney's version.
