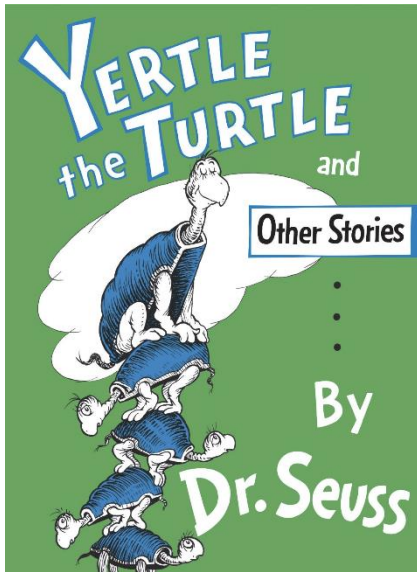

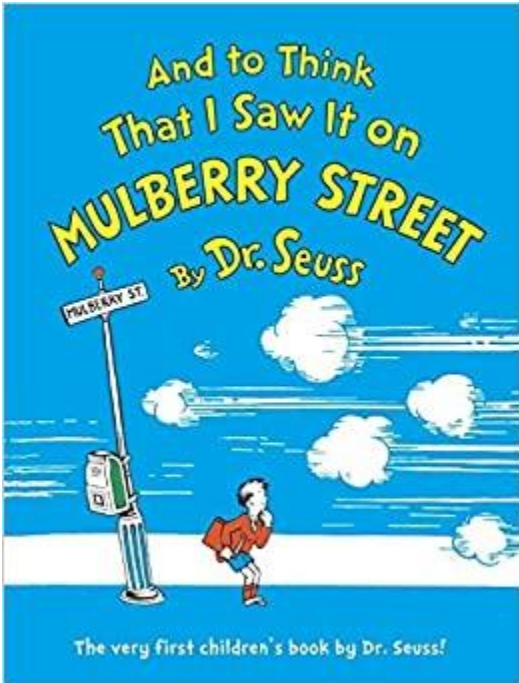

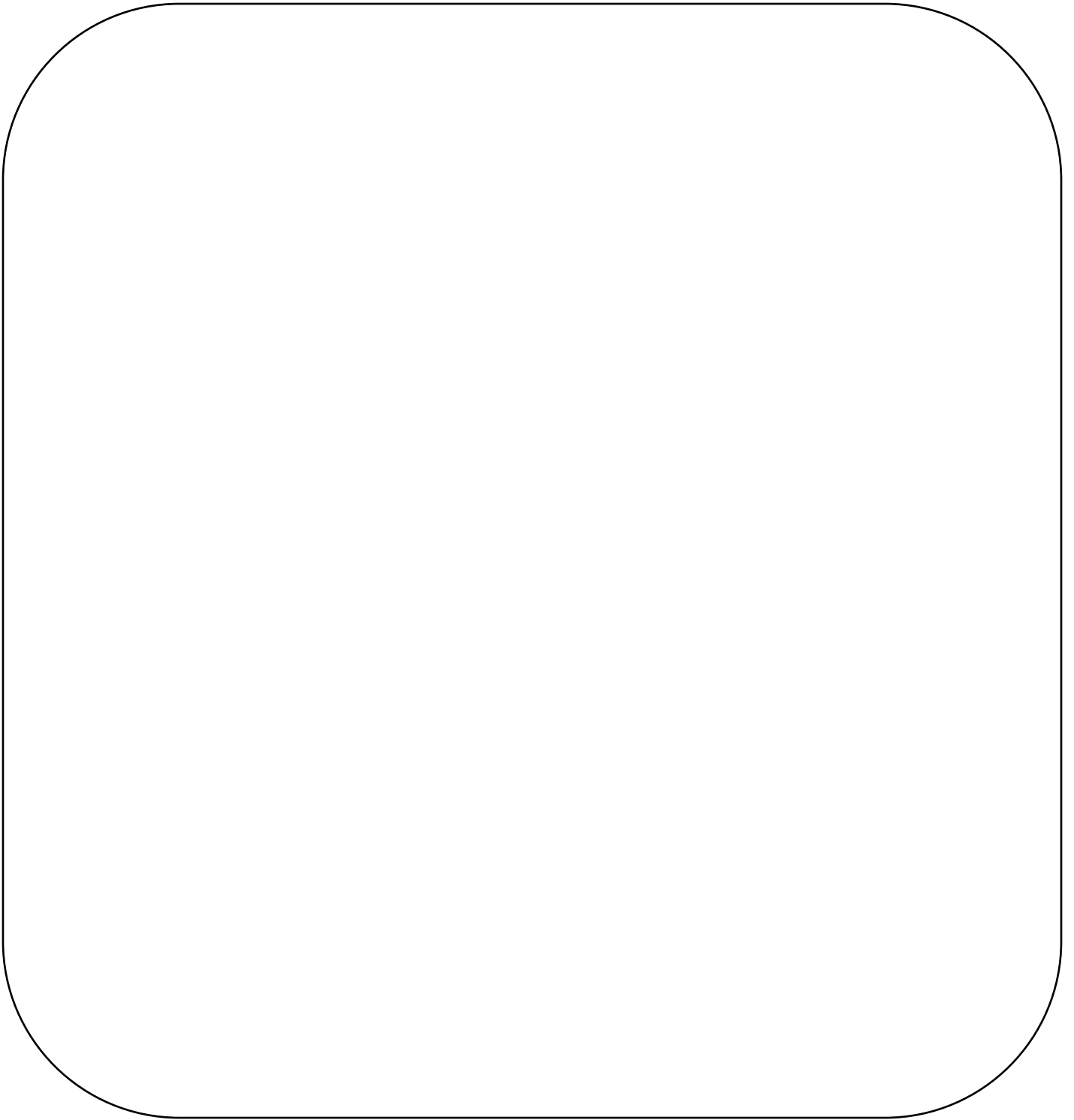
Song to Sing: Here we go 'Round the Mulberry Bush

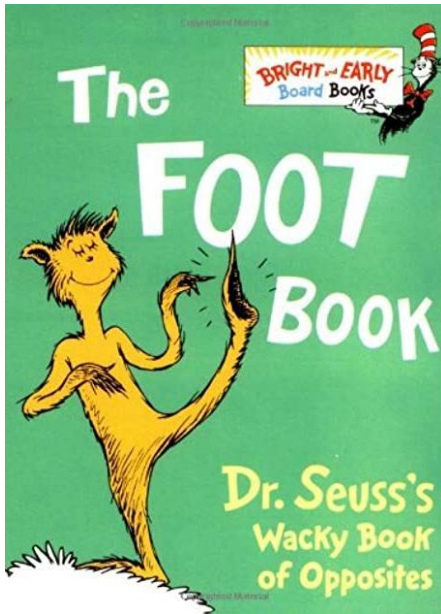

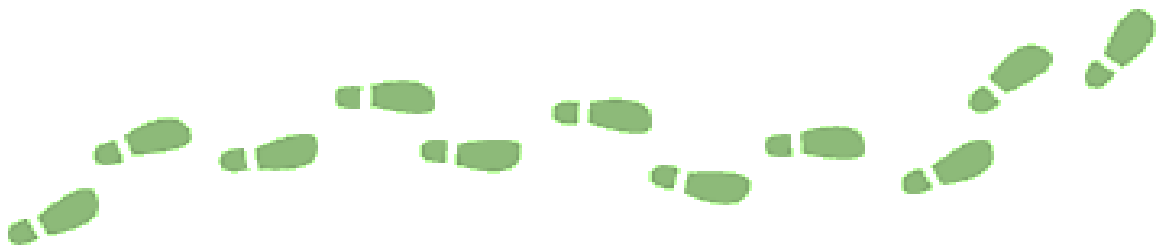

And turn yourself around

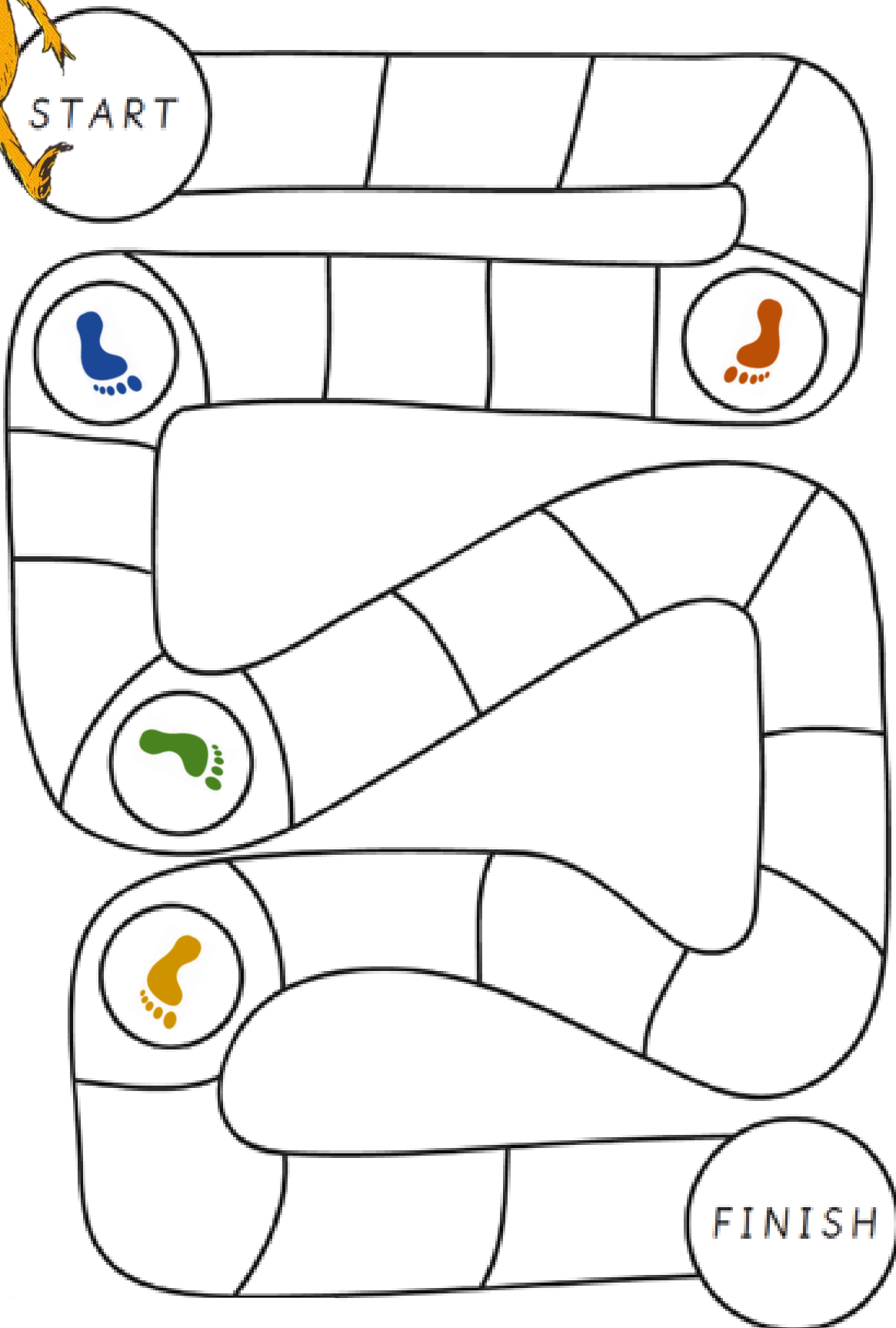
(each of the following verses, switch to right foot, left arm, right arm, head, backside...)

A Game of Opposites



Rules: Print game board and cards on cardstock. Cut out cards and pile the up face down. On your turn, take a card and tell the other players what the opposite is of the word on the card, then move you gamepiece (a penny or a mini-figure...) the number of spaces written on the card. If you land on a foot space, move double what the card says on your next turn. Take turns drawing cards and telling opposites until someone lands on the finish space. Make your own extra cards as needed.

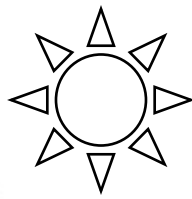

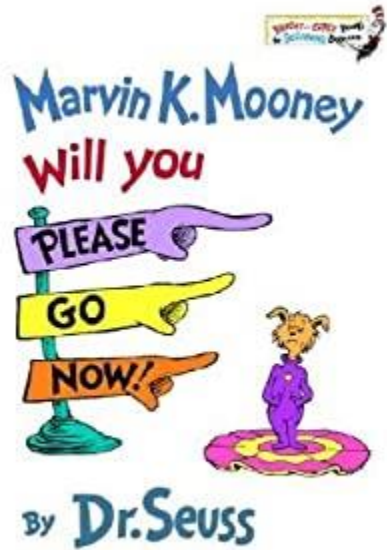

The little one stops to tie his shoe*

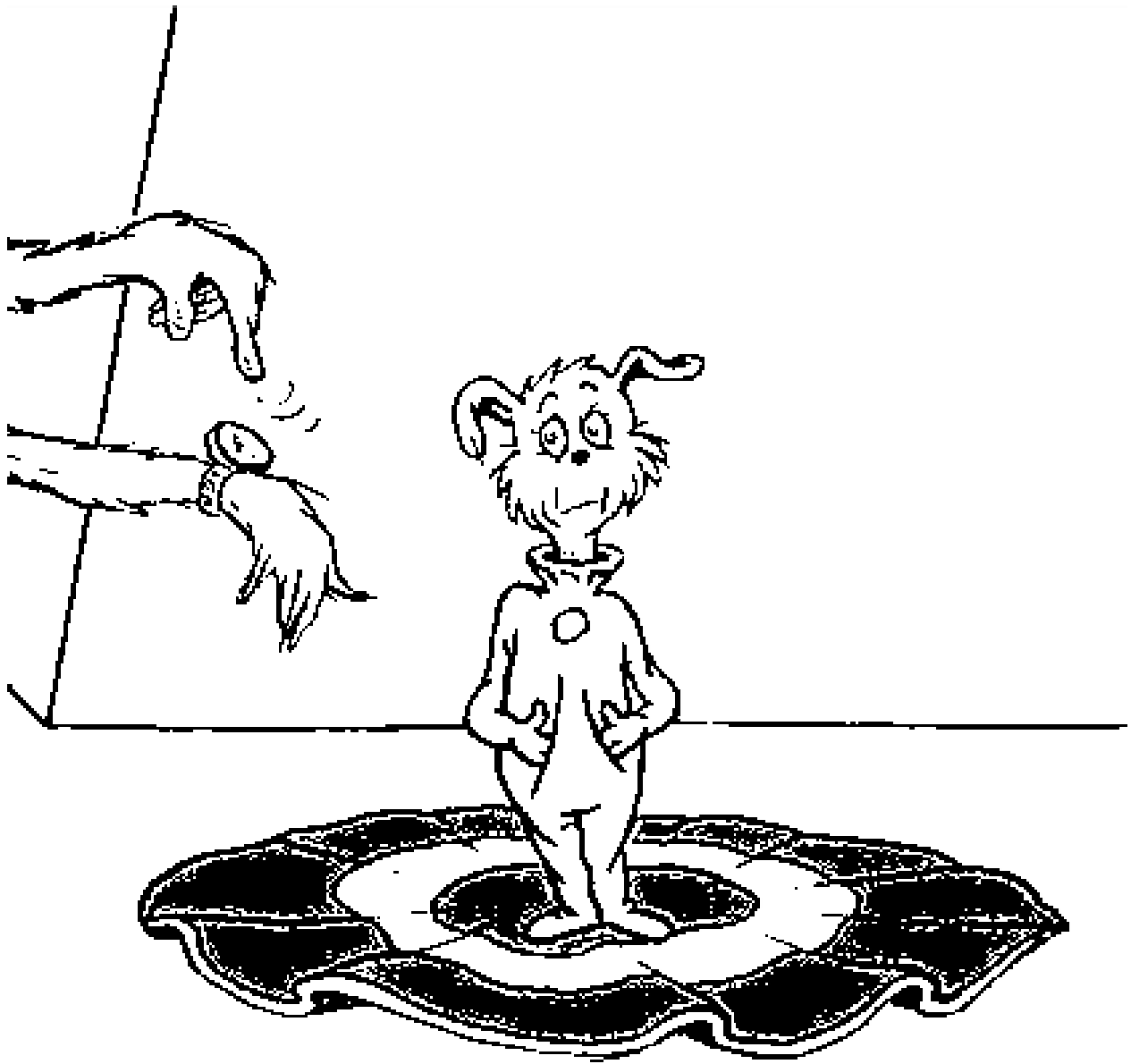
*The ants go marching three by three,

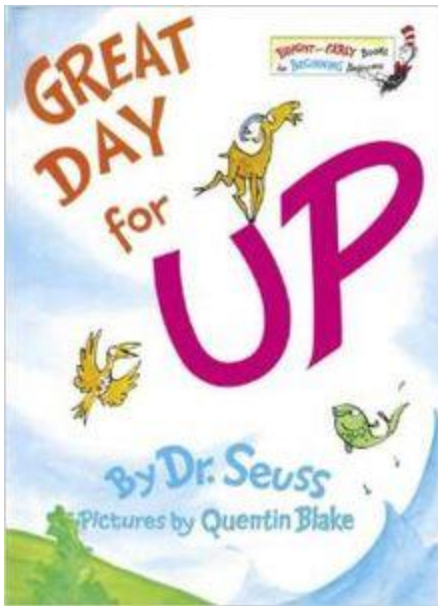

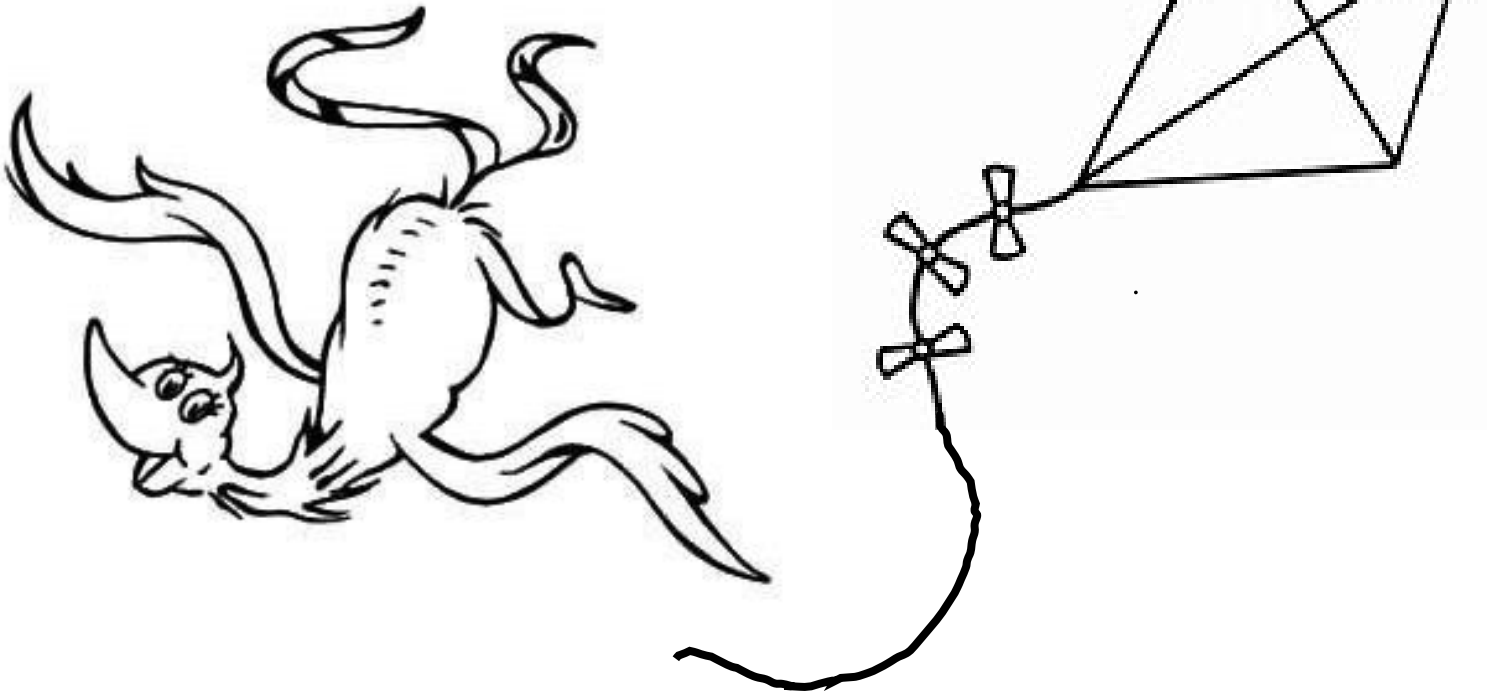
Song to Sing: The Itsy Bitsy Spider

and the itsy bitsy spider climbed up the spout again.

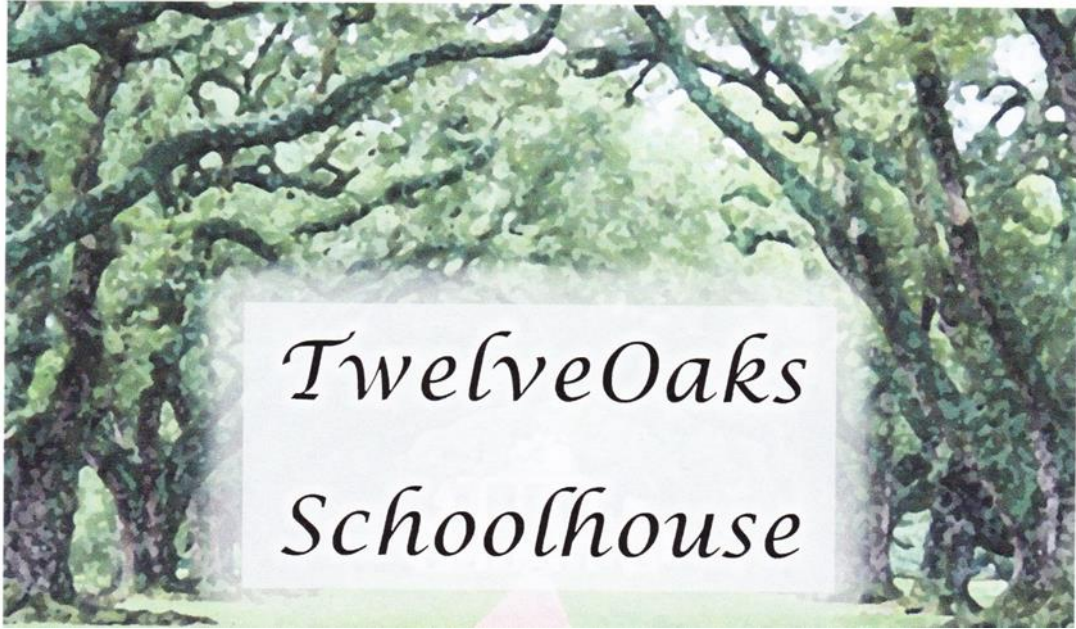
Fingerplay
