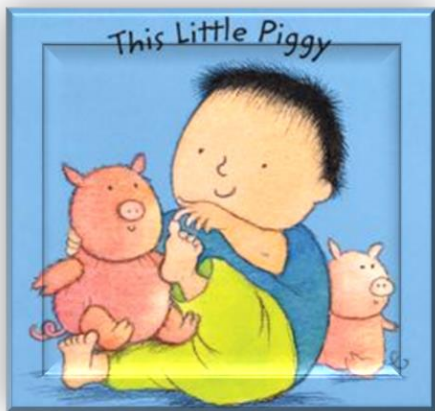

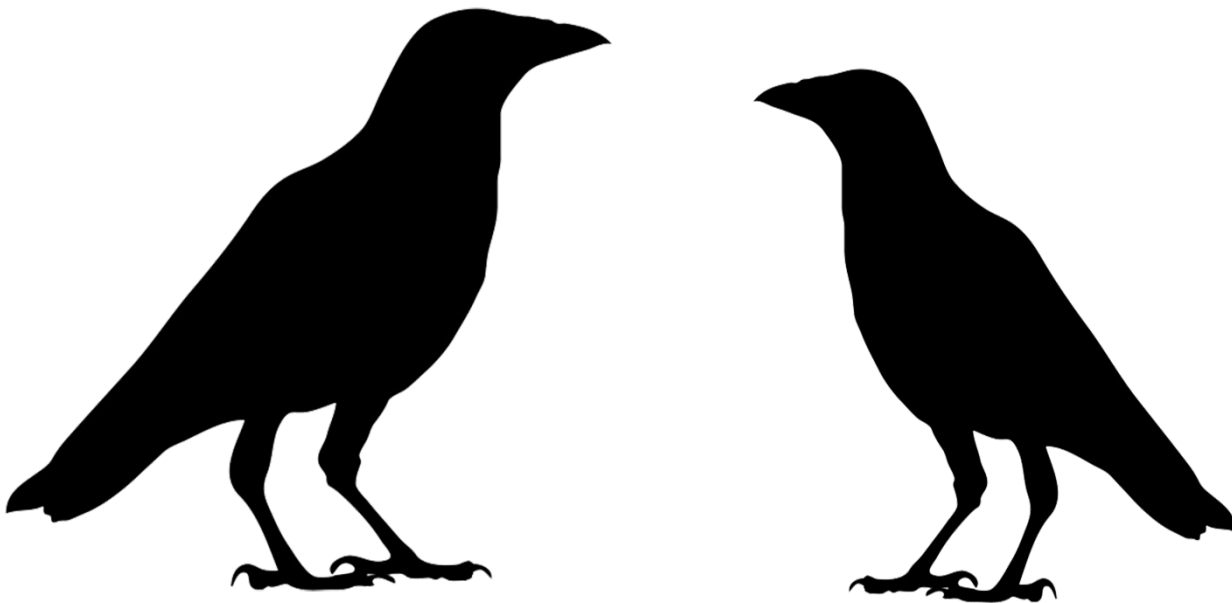
I'm a Little Teapot

what to do.

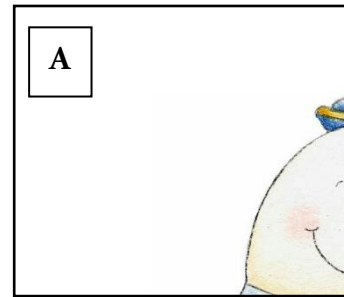
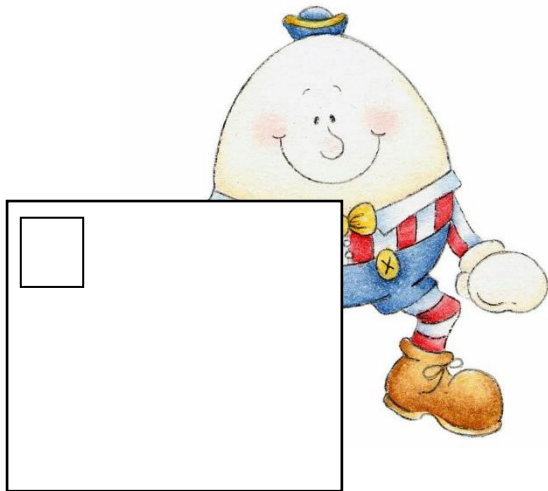
Mother Goose Math

1. Little Bo Peep found 2 sheep this morning and 1 sheep this afternoon. How many sheep did she find altogether?

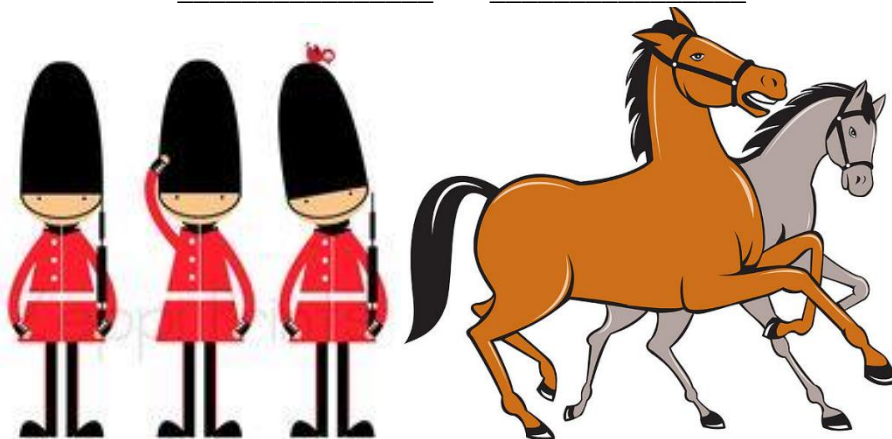
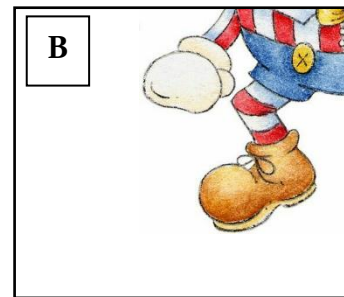


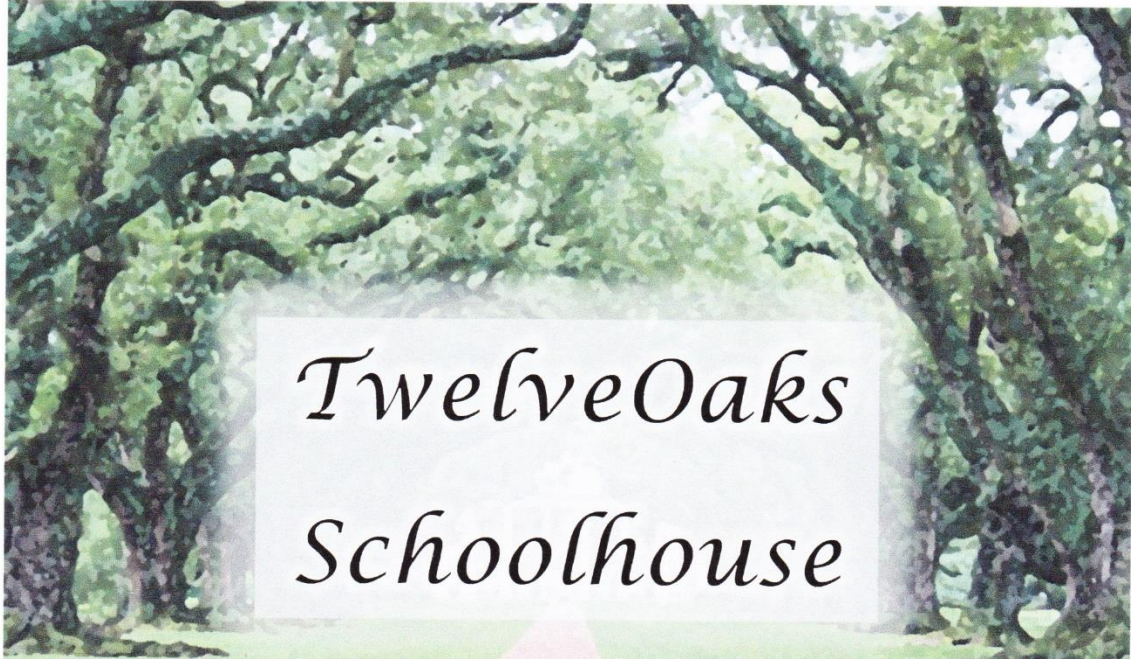
